Mrs. William H. Bates Matron of Honor

The WILLIAM H. BATES (SSN-680) is one of twelve nuclear-powered attack submarines contracted to Ingalls Nuclear Shipbuilding division of Litton Industries by the United States Navy. Builder of submarines since 1957, Ingalls has already delivered nine nuclear submarines to the Navy fleet, and has three others, including the WILLIAM H. BATES, under construction.

WILLIAM H. BATES is a STURGEON CLASS submarine, designed to be one of the most effective weapons systems in the Navy's anti-submarine arsenal. It is 292 feet, 3 inches in length, has a beam of 31 feet, eight inches, a surface displacement of 3,800 tons, and a submerged displacement of 4,600 tons. Manned by a highly trained crew of twelve officers and 95 enlisted men, the WILLIAM H. BATES is built to travel fast and silent deep within the oceans. The submarine will have a primary mission as an anti-submarine weapon, but will also have the capabilities of a mine-layer, supporter of underwater demolition operations, and will be capable of participating in many types of reconnaissance and intercept missions.

WILLIAM H. BATES is named in honor of the late United States Representative William H. Bates of Massachusetts, who was devoted to the vital importance of the nation's seapower. Congressman Bates, as a member of the House Armed Service's Committee and the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy, was a vigorous advocate and effective supporter of the development of nuclear power for Naval vessels.

Congressman Bates' daughter, Mrs. Andrew R. Grainger, is sponsor of the submarine named after her father. Mrs. Bates is her daughter's matron of honor.
