



Benjamin Franklin left an indelible stamp on America. He was a statesman, a scientist, and a philosopher, with interests ranging from the framing of the Constitution to the mysteries of electricity. Born in Boston in 1706, Franklin entered public life at the age of 48 after a successful business and literary career. He remained active in public affairs until his death in 1790.

The submarine named in his honor is the 32nd Polaris submarine launched for the Navy. It is 425 feet long, displaces 7,000 tons and, when it becomes operational next year, will be armed with 16 2,500-mile range Polaris missiles.
