

USS SNOOK SS(N)592

The submarine being launched today is the second of five nuclear powered submarines being built for the United States Navy by The Ingalls Shipbuilding Corporation.

Keel of the SNOOK was laid April 7, 1958. She is a sister-ship to the SCULPIN SS(N)590, launched by Ingalls last March 31st from the adjoining shipway (pictured left). It was from this same shipway that the recently delivered diesel-electric submarine USS BLUEBACK SS581 was built and launched.

SNOOK is of the same design as the USS SKIPJACK SS(N)585, which is said to be the fastest and most maneuverable underwater vessel in the world today.

SNOOK is named for the famous USS SNOOK SS279, lost in action in World War II. Mrs. Georgie L. Walling, Sponsor for the new SNOOK being launched here today, is the mother of the late Commander J. F. Walling, commanding officer of the original SNOOK when it was lost in action.


